# Forest Green Code

- Walk within the Forest School
- Respect the log circle - Do not move it
- Keep everything out of your mouth- no picking/no licking
- Stay within the boundary set
- Do not throw anything
- You can carry sticks shorter than your arm's length, but make sure you think about how close they are to other children- two arms apart
- Drag sticks
- Care for nature and others in the forest
- Digging large holes is not allowed
- Be careful! Check the ground for trip hazards
- Ask an adult before you use a tool and follow the tool rules
- The site in the woodland must always be left as it was found
- Always wash hands following a session

# What your child will need every Wednesday

School Jumpers/cardigans needed, but own clothes on lower half **FOR ALL SESSIONS**

## **NAME ALL ITEMS OF CLOTHING!**

- School jumper or cardigan
- Own top/s underneath, school polo tops not needed- wear something warm and layer up to keep warm
- Comfy trousers/leggings- not jeans and no shorts
- Waterproof footwear- walking boots/ shoes ideal or bring wellies- no crocs or open toes
- Waterproof jacket/coat preferably with hood
- Waterproof trousers to bring in schoolbag (all in one waterproof also fine)
- Warm hat/gloves/scarf weather permitting

## Weekly Sessions

Your child will take part every Wednesday in an outdoor learning session based on the Forest school approach. During our sessions we will be encouraging children to take part in a range of activities from spotting hazards and mapping out boundaries, to team building exercises to promote resilience such as den making and bridge building. The sessions allow for self-reflection time to promote wellbeing. We will be encouraging creative skills and self-risk assessment all within a nurturing environment.

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
